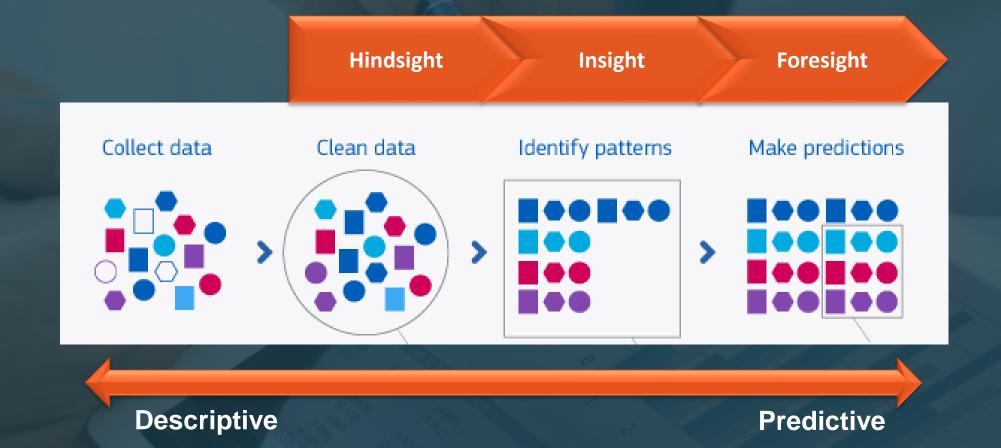


Hindsight to Foresight

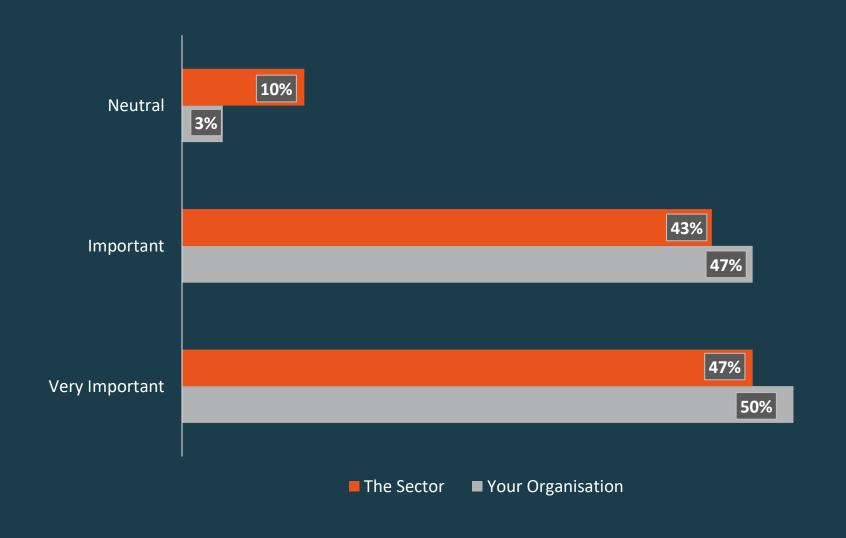

How Important is analytics now?

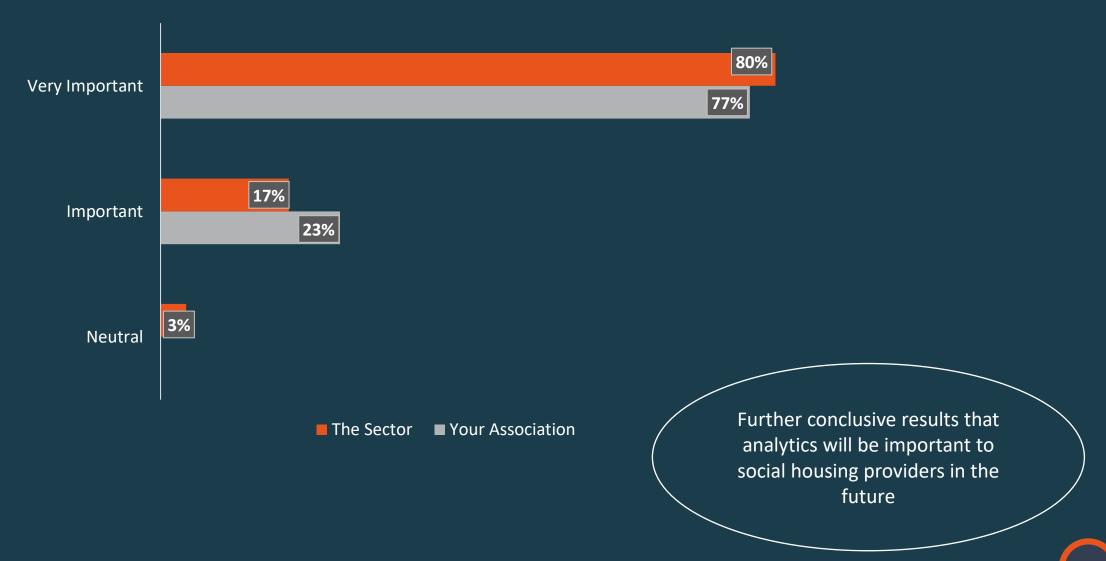




The results show conclusively that social housing providers feel analytics is important to their organisation and the sector

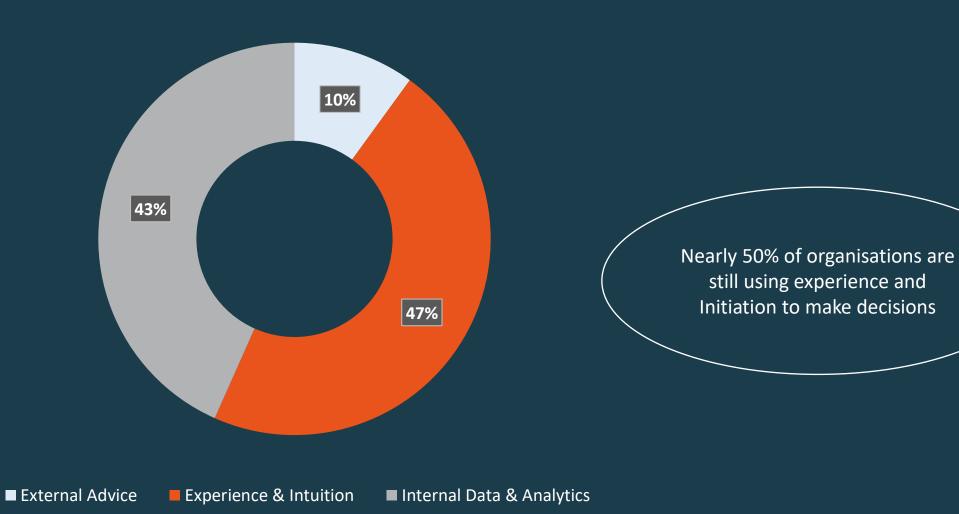
How Important will analytics be in the future?





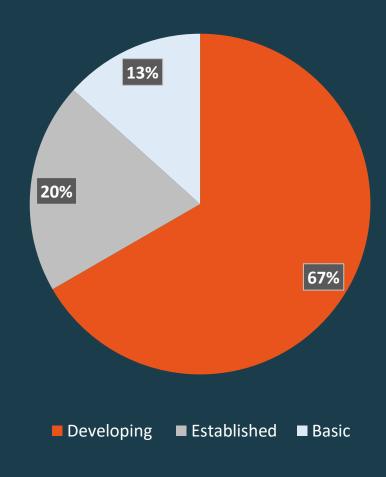
How are executive decisions made?







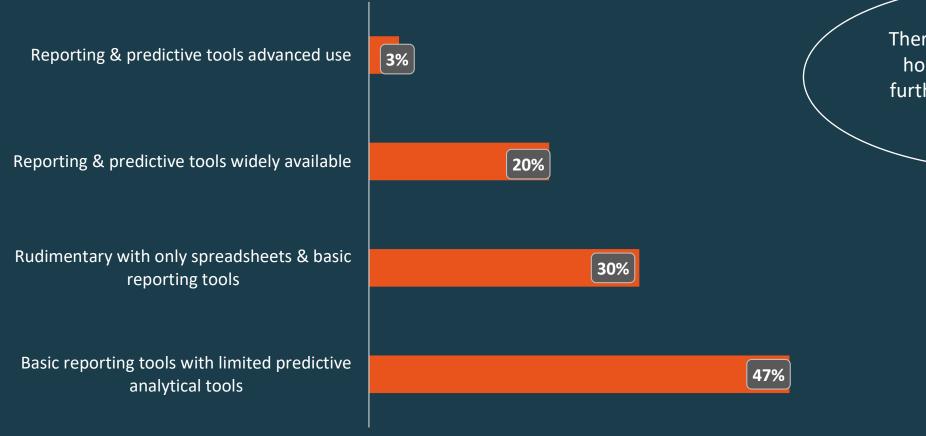




Social housing providers are starting to develop their analytics capabilities
